You may have to choose a **primary care physician (PCP).**** To determine details like this, check your Summary of Benefits and Coverage document. PCPs do more than give you a checkup. They know you and your medical history. They can help guide you and direct your care.

This plan also gives you access to tools, tips, programs and services. They can help you find network doctors, estimate costs and more.

See what's covered

All employer health plans are different. This booklet gives a general idea of how the Aetna Open Access Elect Choice plan works. And how you can get the most out of it.

	A specialist is a doctor who focuses only on treating certain conditions or diseases. For example, a dermatologist treats skin conditions. A cardiologist treats heart problems.	With this option, you may pay more out of pocket.

You need to see network providers for the plan to cover and help pay for care. There is no coverage for services from out-of-network providers.[†] Providers are professionals and facilities that provide health care services. Doctors, hospitals and labs are examples of providers.

^{**}In Texas, PCP is known as physician (primary care). In the State of Washington, PCP refers to primary care provider.

Missouri members are not required to choose a PCP but are encouraged to do so. Missouri members DO NOT need a referral from their PCP to see a specialist.

^{***}In Texas, this approval is known as "pre-service utilization review" and is not "verification" as defined by Texas law.

†Out-of-network emergency services are covered. In Missouri, two mental health visits with an out-of-network provider are covered.
