
Get to know your health plan ID card.

Your health plan ID card includes information about you and your coverage. Carry it with you wherever you go, and show it when you visit your doctor or pharmacy so they know how to bill for their services. Remember to destroy your old ID card.




How to print a temporary or request a replacement health plan ID card on myuhc.com®

After becoming a UnitedHealthcare member, the quickest way to print a temporary ID card or request a replacement ID card is to go online to myuhc.com.

- 1. Simply go to myuhc.com, log in (or register if it's your first time visiting the site).
- 2. Once on your home page, click the "Account Settings" link located at the top of the page.
- 3. Under "My Account Settings", select the option to print a temporary ID card or request a new ID card by postal mail.
- 4. Follow the easy directions via the site to submit or print.

For new registrations, you can view your temporary health plan ID card approximately 48-72 hours after the health plan ID card is requested on myuhc.com
